THE STUDENT

Education at St. Ann's is inspiring and inclusive where freedom and responsibility go hand in hand. Every student of St.Ann's is treated as an individual and given full opportunity for growth. The natural talent of the students is tapped and nurtured, thus helping them reach their full potential. Students of St.Ann's are the representatives of the college; they are expected to uphold the standards of the college both within and outside. Conformity of the students to the rules and regulations of the college is essential for the benefit of both.

General Conduct

- 1. The College lays stress on attendance, It is compulsory for the students to have a minimum of 75% in each subject to be eligible to appear for the final examinations.
- 2. Students should be punctual and attend all their lectures regularly.
- 3. Students are required to maintain discipline which is essential for the development of the individual and College.
- 4. All the students are excepted to conduct themselves in a manner befitting the college community and due respect should be given to all the faculty members.
- 5. Students are required to come decently dressed to the college, Dignity and decorum should be maintained at all times.
- 6. Students should not bring valuables to the college. It is their responsibility to take care of their belongings. The college is not responsible for any loss of valuables.
- 7. Every kind of demonstration that restricts freedom of the members of the college, or disrupts any activity in the college is banned.
- 8. Students are required to carry their identity cards all the time, the same should be produced when required by college authorities.
- 9. Students guilty of serious misconduct or whose presence in the college is detrimental to the order and discipline on the campus are liable to be expelled
- 10. Ragging is a punishable offence and is strictly banned in the college. The college has 'zero' tolerance to ragging.
- 11. Students must park their vehicles in the designated places.

Admission Procedure

- The admission schedule and call for applications to the courses offered are displayed on the college website.
- Application forms for admission and prospectus can be obtained by the candidates on payment of the relevant amount through website.
- Candidates should submit the application form duly filled in, within the prescribed time and can check the admission status online.
- The Course Combination and Second Language, once opted for cannot be changed.
- Copies of the following documents and certificates are to be submitted together with the application form at the time of registration.
 - a) Memo of marks obtained in the intermediate/equivalent Exam
 - b) Transfer certificate
 - c) Bonafide / Conduct certificate.
 - d) Any other Merit certificate.
- A provisional list of selected candidates will be displayed on the notice board, as per the admission notification. It shall be the responsibility of the candidates to ascertain their selection.

- Once the candidates name appears on the selected list, they must come in person to the college to complete the admission procedure
- At the time of Admission, candidates have to submit the documents mentioned above in Original. In addition to this they have to submit the following:
 - a) 4 (four) Passport size photographs each (recent only) of applicant, parent and guardian.
 - b) Eligibility certificate from Board of Intermediate Education,
 - T.S. for students from other states.
 - c) Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from a foreign university should submit all the relevant information / document which justify the equivalence of their qualification, along with the approval of Osmania University.
 - d) Migration Certificate
 Provisionally selected candidates are called for interview
- indicating the date and time. The candidates shall appear for the interview along with their parents, bringing with them their original certificates for document verification.
- The admission committee comprising staff members from all disciplines offers pre-admission counseling to each and every candidate and guides them in choosing the right course.
- Preference is given to sports/ NCC/ Differently abled students by verifying their eligibility certificates issued by concern authorities.

Discipline

The smooth functioning of the College depends upon observance of discipline by the students. The College can help the students better when Rules of Discipline are observed properly. The concept of discipline is closely related to college effectiveness mainly through appropriate values, ethos, and aspirations. Violation of these rules deprives the students of the advantages of different facilities provided by the College. Following are some of the important rules of discipline:

- 1. Students must attend lectures, practicals, etc. as per the Time Table. They must not abstain from classes, practicals examinations etc. without written permission of the Principal.
- 2. The Identity Card is meant for identifying bonafide students and is used for permitting the student to participate in various activities and programs of the College. Every student must wear the Identity Card as long as in the College campus. It must be produced by the student whenever demanded by a member of the teaching or non-teaching staff of the college.

Attendance

- 75% attendance in each subject is compulsory to write the end semester examinations and to avail scholarships. 10% condoning of attendance is permissible on medical grounds.
- A student representing the Institution, University, State or Nation in Sports, NCC, NSS or Cultural or any other officially sponsored activities, is eligible to claim the attendance for that period as recommended by the Head of the Department and Principal of the College.

The list of students having shortage of attendance as per the mentioned norms is displayed on the respective departmental notice boards every month. The same is also communicated to parents.

- Students applying for leave should fill up the leave Proforma get it signed by the parent and class incharge and submit it to the Dean, Student Affairs.
- When absence is caused by unforeseen events, application for leave must be submitted to the Dean, Student Affairs, within 3 days of returning to the college.

STUDENT FACILITIES & SUPPORT SERVICES

Infrastructure

St. Ann's College is housed on a four acre campus adopting a draft master plan for development considering the present and future needs. The UG and PG block consists of a total of 46 lecture halls with adequate furniture. The institution provides 34 well equipped laboratories for Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Micro-biology, Genetics, Nutrition, Bio-chemistry, Bio-Technology, Commerce, Psychology and a museum. A modern state of art computer center is located in fully air-conditioned block. It also has Language Laboratories for English and French with all the requisite audio-visual aids, software programs and applications. Provision of relevant learning resources in keeping with the institution's vision of empowering the girl student by way of skill enhancement is made.

Towards integrating ICT into teaching- learning process, college has six seminar halls on all the floors and six more lecture halls are fully equipped with Audio visual aids. To cater multifarious academic, cultural and literary activities it has St. Joseph's Auditorium with a seating capacity of 1200 with excellent acoustics.

The eight centers of excellence: SACRed (St. Ann's Centre for Research & Development), CWS (Centre for Women Studies), ICT (Centre for Information & Communication Technology), SAHHARA (St. Ann's helping hands and reaching arms), Centre for Competitive Examinations, Ed Cell (Entrepreneurship Development Cell), Sanskriti and SAKSHAM have fully equipped learning resources, library and ICT aids. The aesthetically laid out

and well maintained sports grounds are utilized for the conduct of intra and intercollege tournaments and coaching camps. It has well laid courts for basketball, volleyball and handball, Kho-Kho and Tennikoit and fully equipped Gymnasium.

In addition to the above it has spacious Canteen, Air conditioned conference hall, counseling center, NRC (Network Resource Centre), Corporation Bank extension center, protected drinking water facility on each floor, Fire extinguishers on each floor, Guest room, Health Centre, Prayer room, Diet counseling Centre, Intercom facility, 22 faculty rooms and a stationary shop. The excellent infrastructure has a bearing on the academic excellence and holistic development of our students.

LIBRARY & INFORMATION CENTRE

Under Infrastructure Student Services:

The Library located in the heart of the campus is the intellectual cross roads of the college, connecting people and ideas. With its quiet atmosphere and well-lit study areas, the library is a hub of academic inquiry. It is fully automated, with on-line public access catalogue, (OPAC), LAN, Internet (free access) and photo-copying facilities.

The Library got the registration renewed under the scheme of INFLIBNET (Information & Library Network Centre-UGC) for E-resource-List (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content), Under the National Mission on Education through ICT, an Inter University Centre of the UGC. We are now equipped to extend the e-resources to the students/users. This will make it possible for students to use all the free online resources approximately e-resources (6,000+ journals and 31,35,000+ ebooks) on line at any location, national and international journals. College also registered with National Digital Library of India (NDL) and Digital Library of India (DLI) is a digital collection of freely accessible rare books collected from various libraries in India .Digital Library of India has currently 550,585 books with 191,657,791 pages (191.632 Million approx) in Portable Document Format(PDF) is available. This Project is funded by the Department of Electronics and Information Technology(DeitY), The Ministry of Communication and information Technology(MCIT). This also enables use free downloading of all materials.

The Library (UG+PG) has a rich collection of more than **84691** books on various subjects .As many as **106** Scientific and Technical journals/periodicals and **2662** CD-ROMs/DVDs are available for users.

The Dewey Decimal classification is followed for arranging books in the library. Online and offline information combine to provide a comprehensive package of Library services.

Lending Services:

- 1. Each student may borrow five/six books at a time
- 2. Students may borrow reference books and CDS/DVDS after college hours on overnight basis.
- 3. The borrowed books will not be renewed, if the book is in demand.
- 4. The Library Book Bank Service (UGC grants) allows SC/ST/BC students to avail and retain the books till the end of their final exams, in addition to books borrowed on cards.
- 5. Exchange of ID cards and Library cards is not permitted. Please note that the person who lends her card is responsible for the book, in the event of a book being lost. Hence it is mandatory for students to produce their ID cards before entering the Library.

Rules and Regulations

- 1. Strict silence should be maintained in the library.
- 2. Books will be issued or renewed only if the student produces the identity card.
- 3. Personal belongings are to be left in the rack at the entrance of the library. Only one note book is allowed inside. Valuables/Cell phones should not be left outside the library.
- 4. Books are to be returned on the due date. A fine of 50 paisa per day will be charged for the books returned after the due date.
- 5. Books are to be replaced in their respective shelves after reading and reference.
- 6. Loss of library books should be immediately brought to the notice of the library. They should be replaced with the latest edition.
- 7. Library books are to be used with care and returned without damage. Damaged books will not be accepted and must be replaced.
- 8. Students must return all books/cards and settle any outstanding dues at the end of the academic year, to obtain the NO DUES certificate.
- 9. Surveillance Cameras are installed in the library as a security measure.



EXAMINATION SYSTEM


St.Ann's follows Credit Based Semester System (CBSS) & Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) integrating continuous internal assessment along with end semester evaluation.


Under CBCS, an academic year consists of two semesters(odd and even) and performance of students are declared in terms of grades and Grade point average. The institution assesses every student's performance by both Continuous Internal Assessment - CIA and End Semester Examination-ESE.

- The ratio of CIA and ESE is 30:70 for U.G. and P.G.
- A student has to earn the minimum prescribed credits for the award of degree.
- A 10-point absolute grade system is adopted for calculation of Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA).



Presently, based on feedback/suggestions from parent university/BOS members exam cell had deliberated the following policy revisions to be implemented from the academic year 2021-22 from R21 batch on wards





Continuous Internal Assessments CIA

- Two written internal tests of twenty marks each for a duration of 1 hr. and the third test for 20 marks by way of Seminars / Quiz / Assignment etc are conducted. The total marks obtained in the three tests out of 60 is then scaled down to 30.
- A student can appeal to the course teacher or approach the head of the Department for any clarification, regarding evaluation, immediately after receiving the valued scripts.
- A student absent for any internal exams will lose the marks in the test.
- No retest or improvement is conducted for internal assessment, seminars and Project Work.
- Retest will be conducted only if a student is absent due to authorized participation in college programmes like sports, competition, NCC/NSS activities etc.

End Semester Examination ESE

- 75% of attendance is compulsory for all the students to appear the end semester Examinations.
- Condonation up to 10% may be considered by the Principal on medical grounds / on a case to case basis.
- Passing minimum is 40% in ESE and 40% in aggregate (marks in the end semester and internal examination put together) for both theory and practicals.
- A student who has not cleared a paper in ESE can appear for the paper in the next even semester. All backlog exams are conducted in the even semesters.
- For Practicals, 50% of evaluation is done by internal examiner and 50% by an external examiner chosen for each paper from the approved panel of examiners.



General rules

Examination Fees

Students are required to pay the prescribed end semester examination fees in the Examination office after submitting the examination form duly filled.

Examiners

The External Examiners will be appointed by the Controller of Examinations from panel of Examiners recommended by the Board of Studies of each department. The functions of the External Examiners are to set the question papers, prepare the scheme of valuation, value the answer scripts and prepare the marks lists.

Double valuation is adopted for P.G. The answer scripts will be valued by two examiners, out of which at least one will be external from the panel of examiners approved by the Board of Studies. The marks awarded to that answer script shall be the average of these two evaluations. If the difference in marks between the two evaluations is 20% or more of the marks, such scripts shall be assessed by a **third examiner** (internal). Average of the two higher evaluations out of the three will be taken.

Recounting Provision for recounting is given for P.G. Students.A student can apply within the prescribed time limit for recounting of marks.

Revaluation

A student can appeal for recounting of marks, or revaluation of the paper within ten full days after the announcement of results, on payment of prescribed fee. In the case of revaluation, the better of the two scores will be considered.

Improvement Examinations

Improvement exam for a paper is permitted once, on the next even semester, provided the candidate has cleared all the courses.

Such improved grade will not be counted for the award of prizes / medals / rank.

Backlog Examinations

Backlog examinations are conducted only during even semesters.

Malpractice

- ♦ In case of malpractice in the internal examination, CIA for that particular paper will be scrapped.
- ♦ In the ESE if any student indulges in malpractice or is caught in possession of any written material or electronic gadgets, the examinations for all papers printed in the hall ticket will be cancelled, as per norms laid down by Osmania University.

Declaration of Results

End Semester Examination results will be published after approval from the Result committee members, comprising Controller of examinations OU, Additional controllers of respective faculty along with the internal result committee members (within 40 days from the last examination)

- ♦ If a student passes in all the papers of a semester, the result is declared as PASS.
- ♦ If a student is absent for End Semester Examination, the course result is declared as ABSENT. However, her CIA marks will be carried forward.
- ♦ Semester memorandum of marks will have only grades secured by the students in every subject.

Promotion Policy

♦ If a student has the **required attendance and registered for semester examination** in the odd semester, she will be promoted to the next semester. There is no detention in the odd semester.

- ♦ However, in the even semester she has to clear at least 50% of the total number of papers (theory and practicals taken together) of courses in all the previous semesters, to be promoted to the next semester. Else, she is detained.
- * Registration means submitting examination form within the prescribed time, payment of fees for the papers appearing an obtaining Hall Ticket for the said examination.

Course Completion

The prescribed of number of credits to be acquired for the award of Degree

A student is permitted to complete her course within n+2 years duration where 'n' is the actual course duration.

During this period, even if the syllabus is revised, the candidate reappearing shall be allowed to write according to the old syllabus.

Extra credits for Outstanding Achievements

A student who excels in sports/academics/research/any other field is eligible to earn one extra credit. The qualifying criteria for this will be decided by a committee of senior faculty.

Award of Grades, SGPA, CGPA

The award of Grades, Grade letter, Grade Points, have been revised as per the the CBCS guidelines in the UGC frame work. The marks secured by the student in the internal tests and semester- end examinations are converted into grades and SGPA and CGPA are computed based on the grades and the number of credits for the various courses.

Details of CBCS

Credit is the unit by which the course work is measured. One credit is one hour of teaching work or two hours of practical work per week.

Grade Point is weightage allotted to each grade letter depending on the marks awarded in a course/paper. Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)

SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. SGPA is based on the total **credit points** earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in that Semester.

Calculation of SGPA

SGPA = where Credit Point = (Credit X Grade Point) of the course.

Note: SGPA is computed only if the candidate passes in all the courses (gets a minimum 'D' grade)

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Points Average weighted across all the semesters. CGPA is obtained by dividing the total number of credit points (CPts) in all the semesters by the total number of credits in all the Semesters. The final result at the end of all the semesters is declared in the form of CGPA.

Note: CGPA is calculated only when the candidate passes in all the papers of all the semesters. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Points Average weighted across all the semesters &

is obtained by dividing the total number of credit points (CPts) in all the semesters by the total number of credits in all the Semesters.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills among students. Skill Career oriented courses are offered to second years in both the semesters (Semester III and semester IV).4 courses are offered over two semesters.2 are UGC specified and 2 courses offered are department specified courses. Each semester comprises one UGC specified and one department specified course.

Around 46 department specified courses are available for students. A student gets two credits for each course and a total of eight credits after completion of all the four courses.

Courses run in collaboration with various industries and organizations. Expertise of resource persons and guidance of in-house faculty will enrich students learning experience.
