Student Feedback on Curriculum Analysis 2022-2023

How do you find the curriculum at St. Ann's with respect to?

- 1. CBCS
- a. 69.1% of the respondents felt the choice based credit system is excellent and very good.
- b. 25.6% opined that the CBCS was good and satisfactory.
- c. Remaining 4.8% expressed for improvement.
- 2. Depth of the course content including practical if any:
- a. 30.8% of the respondents felt the depth of the course content including practical was excellent.
- b. The opinion on the course content including practical was very good by 40.4% respondents.
- c. Remaining 23.8% of the respondents rated that the depth of the course content was good.
- 3. The allocation of the credits to the course?
- a. The respondents whose opinion was excellent on the allocation of the credits to the course was 29%.

- 1. As per the responses received from the peer, Adequacy of Curriculum catering to the Local/Regional/National needs is excellent as per 53% and 46.7% says it is good.

- 3. Plan of Curriculum structure in terms of credits allocation and utilization of syllabus is excellent as per 53% responses and 47% respondents felt it is good.


- 1. The design of the curriculum and the learning experience was excellent for 31.8% respondents and 59.1 % of the alumni felt it was very good.


Report on Employers' Feedback on Curriculum 2022-23

Deloitte, Scientist solutions, ADP, Invesco, ICICI Prudential Life Insurance, Sagility, Unisys IND Pvt Ltd, and other companies provided curriculum feedback in 2022-23. The feedback provided by employers regarding our college's overall curriculum has been instructive. According to the report, most employers concur that the curriculum focuses on skills rather than updated content. Below is a breakdown of the feedback received.



- 1. In the first statement, respondents were asked to assess the curriculum's relevance and the students' career knowledge development. According to the report, all companies agreed that the curriculum at St. Ann's College aids students in gaining knowledge about their chosen professions.
- 2. This statement was requested to determine whether the curriculum emphasizes applying discipline-specific knowledge, techniques, skills, and modern tools. The report revealed that most of the companies rated very good, and some agreed it is good. This implies that the curriculum emphasizes the need to improve discipline-appropriate knowledge, techniques, skills, and modern tools.
- 3. This statement was requested to assess the curriculum's ability to equip students with the personal, social, and employability skills necessary to pursue successful careers. The report indicates that few of the companies were rated outstanding, while more companies were rated very good. This indicates that the curriculum does an very good job of equipping students with the personal, social, and employability skills they need to pursue successful careers.

- 4. This question was posed to determine how much the curriculum helps students develop communication and soft skills. The report explains that all the companies agreed that the curriculum shapes students' communication and social skills development. This indicates that the curriculum effectively shapes students' communication and emotional skills.
- 5. This statement was intended to assess how curricular practices such as internships, student exchange programs, and field trips equip students with managerial and leadership skills. The report indicates that some companies evaluated it as excellent, while others rated it very good. This indicates that St. Ann's College's curricular practices are superior in preparing students to acquire managerial and leadership skills.
- 6. This question was asked to determine whether or not students have the ability to quickly acquire industrial practices and adapt to the stream. The report explains that some companies were rated excellent, the majority were rated very good, and a small number were rated decent and average. This indicates that the curriculum must develop students' ability to quickly acquire industrial practices and adapt to the stream.

- Develop students' ability to acquire industrial practices and adapt to the stream quickly.
- Additional internships to gain industrial experience and acclimate to the stream

Parents Feedback on Curriculum and Examination Analysis

- 29.3% of respondents thought the courses were excellently relevant to entrepreneurship and employability, 52.3% thought they were very good, and 13.9% thought they were mediocre, which also needs to be improved.
- A focus on skill development was rated as outstanding by 29.5% of parents, very good by 49%, and average by the remaining parents.
- Incorporating values and life skills into the curriculum was rated as outstanding by 32% of respondents, very good by 49.7%, average by 14.6%, and needing improvement by the remaining respondents.
- Academic enrichment through fieldwork, projects, and other value additions was outstanding by 27.4% of parents, very good by 48.9%, and average by 17.5% and the remaining respondents, however, feel that it may be improved.
- The opinion of 30.3% respondents was excellent with regards to exposure to latest technology, 46% participants felt very good regards to tools in the respective courses, 22.9% parents opined average and needs to be improved.
