Sessions on Climate change Global warming

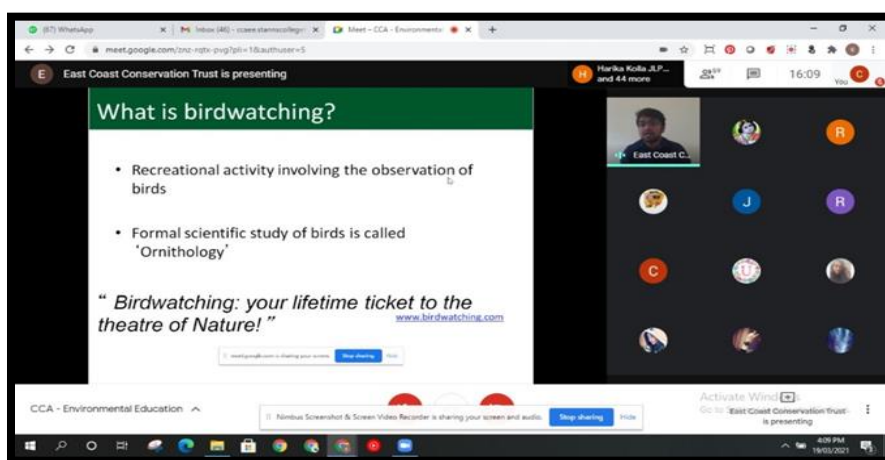

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Session on Biodegradable Sanitary Pads

Event: Awareness on Biodegradable Sanitary Pads/Menstrual Hygiene

Report:

According to the latest National Family and Health Survey 4 data, 58 percent of women in the age group of 15-24 years in India use a hygienic method to deal with menstruation. As per a 2011 market research survey, only 12 percent of India's women used sanitary napkins. Despite the low number, the implications in terms of menstrual waste management is crippling. These end up in landfills and ultimately in the hands of sanitation workers who face the risk of catching infections and other diseases from the exposure. Reusable and biodegradable pads offer a respite from this problem. But reusable pads come with their own issues.

As a part of creating awareness on Biodegradable sanitary pads Eco club on March 26, 2021, organised an awareness session on Menstrual Hygiene and waste management, disposal of sanitary pads, eco friendly alternatives available to avoid plastic napkins hazards both to women using them and to the environment



Eco Club facilitates sale of Biodegradable Sanitary Pads to our students through our Health center and also during Covid time, online purchase and availability details were shared with faculty and students.

Plastic Waste Management

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Approximately 100 million plastic bottles are used and discarded everyday, with 80% of them simply becoming non-biodegradable litter, the trash that is accumulated in the process takes a huge toll on our environment. Plastic material have a significant carbon footprint, also the plastic we use in our daily life takes over 100's of years to bio-degrade and produces toxic fumes.

Therefore in order to create awareness of recycling and repurposing of plastic Dharani ECO club conducted an activity “Plastic Bottle Crafts” where in the students of Environment Education were asked to prepare some creative and useful things out of used plastic bottles. All the Students took part in the event by upcycling some of the plastic products . The participants shared their views saying that they have got to learn something creative through this event. Students prepared various creative and useful things like Pen holders, Cell phone stands etc.

Paper Bags are highly biodegradable and recyclable, and hence does not pose the same environmental footprint as plastic bags do. compared to plastic bags, paper bags are safe and environmentally friendly. Paper bags can be made either with virgin or recycled fibres to meet specific requirements. They are commonly used as shopping carrier bags and packaging for some goods. These bags carry a wide range of products from groceries, clothing, books, electronics and various other goods

Newspaper bag Making/Sanitary pad pouch making was demonstrated to Eco club and Environment Education students by Jessica Ruth to create awareness among students to avoid plastic bags Also students were taught to make sanitary pad disposal pouch using newspapers, to dispose of used pads properly.

As a part Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA I) Paper bag making activity was conducted where in the students were asked to prepare minimum 5 bags each using different kinds of paper like newspaper, Magazines and calendar's etc. students were assessed by there creativity and on time submission.

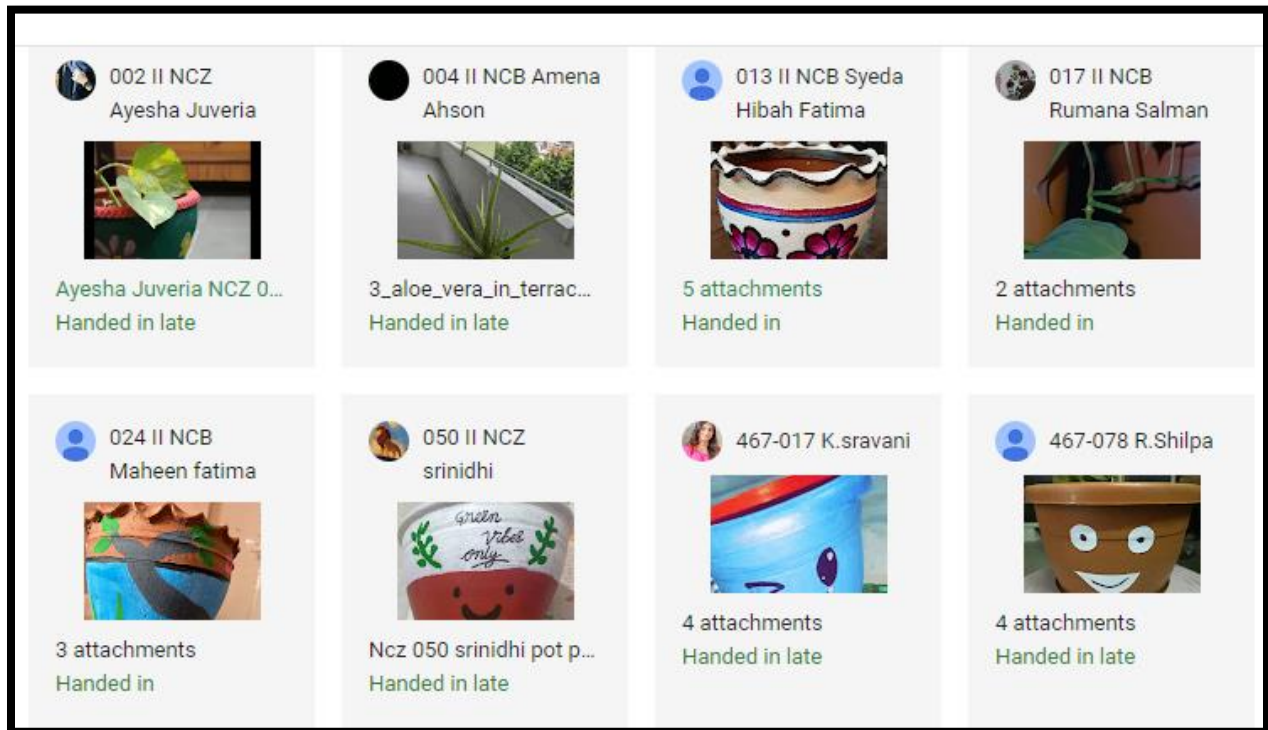

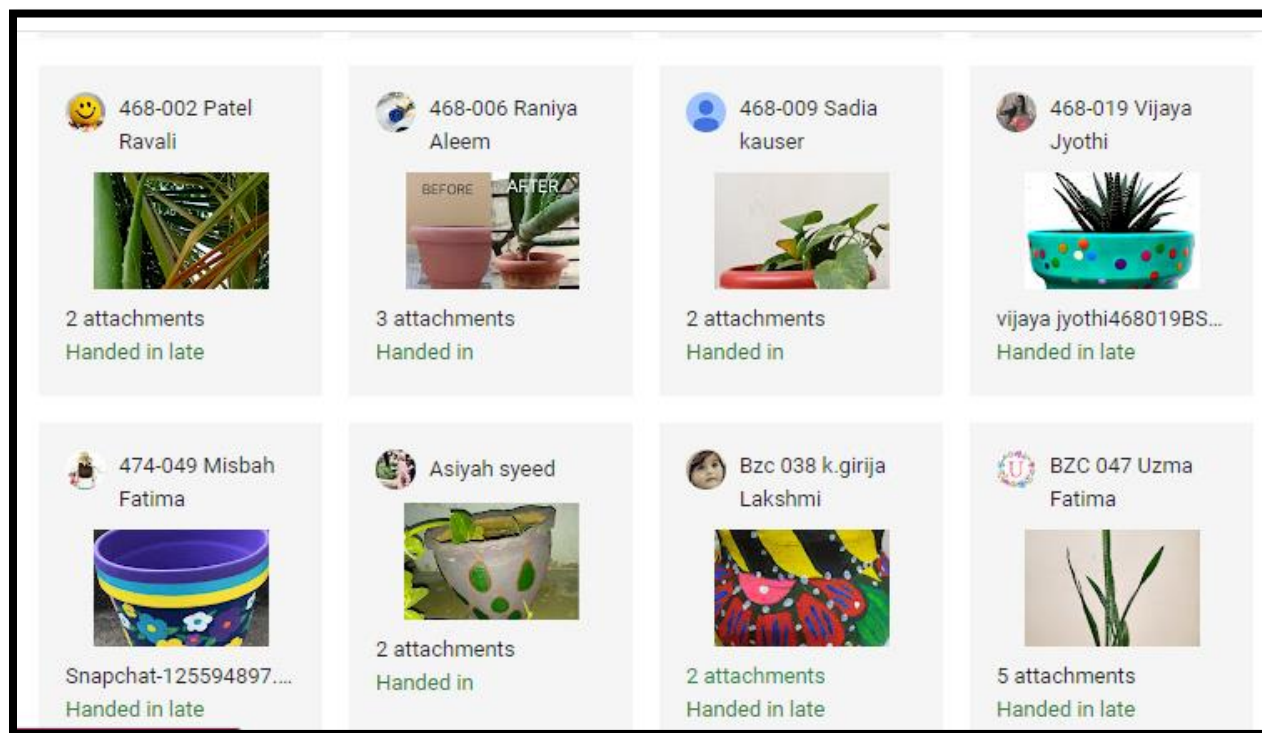

Composting is simply the process of breaking down the organic matter (food waste) in the presence of air and water, using micro organisms and small insects present in nature. The end product is called compost which is rich in readily usable plant nutrients forming a part of healthy soil. Kitchen compost bin can be used to recycle kitchen waste. Composting helps you to get rid of and recycle organic waste such as kitchen scraps, and yard waste such as grass trimmings and leaves. The same can be used to grow plants instead of being thrown away. Compost can replenish and stabilize soil, helping to boost and sustain food production in the future. It can also help pull carbon out of the atmosphere, helping to tackle global warming, and replace polluting chemical fertilizers, protecting public health.

Kitchen waste composting session has been conducted to create awareness on waste management among students and to make them understand how to handle waste in a proper way so that it can reduce the landfills there by promoting environmental consciousness and to reduce pollution.

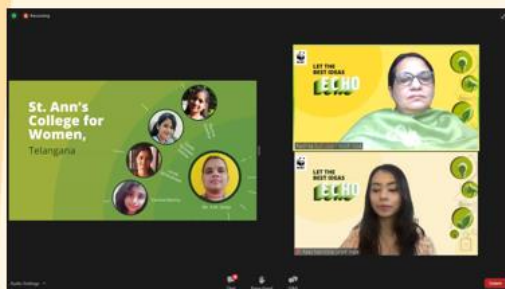
