




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2. National Education Day Celebrations in Collaboration with IIC and Seminar Committee on 10-11-2022


#### **Day 6: Topic – Metamorphosis of Data Security**

The event was successful by the active participation of students, volunteering by the SQAC members (Tuba Mateen, Jameema Nashath, Meenakshi) and the organization.








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8. Two Days Seminar on Quality Enhancement in Research- IPR Issues and Academic Identities(09-12-2022 To 10-12-2022)

Faculty members of different disciplines are benefitted in terms creating academic identities and knowledge about classification and filing of patents.






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### 9. Emerging Role of Administrative Staff in Higher Educational Institutions on 11-02-2023



Attended by: First year Students of all combinations BA, B Com, BSc, BBA, all CCA course coordinators, Class In charges of First year all combinations



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

- To promote the students for enhancing their skills & learn about the various innovative ways to enhance their career.



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
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Outcome of the Event: By the end of the session, the students understood how to get registered for TASK and to attend the online/Offline sessions organized by |TASK.
