**Innovations and Best Practices**

**Environmental practices**



Environment consciousness which can empower the organization to frame a better environmental performance includes energy conservation, use of renewable sources, rainwater harvesting, and efforts of carbon neutrality, plantation, hazardous waste management and e-waste management. Departments, Committee and Clubs put special effort to insist the environmental awareness among the students.

### **The following exercises were embraced to reduce our ecological footprints.**

- ✓ Computer Science department is working with ICT Centre to spread environment consciousness and awareness regarding dangers of e-waste and participating in their e-waste management program by collecting electronic waste.
- ✓ Biochemistry Department conducted Awareness programmes and survey on Menstrual Waste Management and Eco-friendly alternatives for school and college students.
- ✓ E-waste Drive was also organized to collect e-waste from students and also from department and handed over to Green Waves environmental solutions.
- ✓ Biotechnology dept has done awareness programme on Plastic degradation in G. Pulla Reddy High school, Hyderabad.
- ✓ Monitoring by SQAC - Conserve energy by switching off all lights, fans and other equipment when not in use.
- ✓ Hazardous wastes are disposed off separately by following the bio safety rules.
- ✓ E-waste that is generated is deposited in the ICT centre.
- ✓ Plantation of saplings was done as a part of activity under Eco Club.
- ✓ Tree Plantation program under the banner of “Haritha Haram” by Botany Dept.
- ✓ Botany dept. conducted an awareness programme on issues related to Biodiversity and its Conservation in Sri Chaitanya High School, Santosh Nagar Colony, Mehdiapatnam.
- ✓ Distribution of cloth bags for sustainable environment by Chemistry dept.
- ✓ Biochemistry Department conducted Awareness programmes and survey on Menstrual Waste management- and Eco-friendly alternatives for School and college students
- ✓ E-waste and other waste material collected and deposited with the eco club. Also, it's a regular practice to collect dry waste and hand it over to ITC for recycling.

- ✓ The faculty also presented and published paper relating to sustainability development.
- ✓ The departments also conducted competitions like poster making, just a minute on sustainable management.
- ✓ The department ensures that students buy less plastic and bring a reusable bag.
- ✓ The department also educates the students to save electricity and water.
- ✓ Lot of e-content in the classroom teaching is used and students are encouraged to use the e-platform instead of using hard copies.
- ✓ The unused print outs are reused for rough work.
- ✓ Steel bottles are used instead of plastic bottles for drinking water.
- ✓ The food prepared by the girls during the nutrition practical class is consumed by them, faculty and support staff and food wastage is minimized.
- ✓ The kitchen waste generated as part of the practical is used for composting and biogas
- ✓ As part of the green initiative, green greetings are presented to honor the invited speaker in various events.
- ✓ All the dry waste like papers, books etc. are given to the eco club for recycling.
- ✓ Distributed steel bottles to auxiliary staff as a gift on International Women’s Day by CWS
- ✓ The department of biochemistry conducted awareness programmes and survey on menstrual waste management- and ecofriendly alternatives for School and college students also it’s a regular practice to collect dry waste and hand it over to ITC for recycling.
- ✓ E-waste drive was also organized to collect e waste from students and also from department and handed over to green waves environmental solutions by department of biochemistry.
- ✓ Swachh hi Seva Campaign; Collection of plastic, old clothes, up cycling waste are activities done under this campaign wherein department members and students participated actively Tide Turners Plastic challenge by department of biochemistry.



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- ✓ To sensitize students on the importance of biodiversity and its conservation, the department of botany conducted an awareness programme at Sri Chaitanya High School, Santosh Nagar Colony, Mehdiapatnam.
- ✓ Use of sunlight –electromagnetic radiation instead of artificial illumination for microscopy in the department.
- ✓ Periodic checks and cleaning of all gas stoves and bunsen burners in the laboratories.
- ✓ Biomedical & chemical waste is generated and poor management of these can cause various health issues to individuals. Awareness among students and technical staff is continuously created to dispose it in safe manner by using good lab practices.
- ✓ Specimens, cultures and other biological material that are used in microbiology lab will be made into noninfectious before being discarded. Decontamination is carried out by chemical disinfectants and autoclaving. Decontamination by chemical disinfectants is usually done using Dettol. Discarded culture plates are generally autoclaved to ensure organisms in plates are killed.
- ✓ Discarding of bio hazardous waste of hematology experiments is done by using Himedia disposable bags.
- ✓ Hazardous chemicals used like Ethidium bromide when used in molecular biology lab sessions are collected in plastic zip-locking bags and then discarded.
- ✓ Videos related to hazardous waste management in microbiology lab are screened to students to create awareness and ensure safety.
- ✓ The department successfully implemented the usage of handmade paper made “Microbiology Kits” from the R19 batch.
- ✓ Department of microbiology has a regular feature of gifting saplings to resource persons who come for various activities organized and encourages increasing green cover of the city.
- ✓ ICT Tool of Google i.e., google forms were used for registrations and feedback to be collected for Two Day National Level Workshop and Competition Series on Development of smart antimicrobial agent to fight AMR, in collaboration with E-Cell, IIT Mumbai. This ensured reduced usage of paper during workshop organized by depts. of microbiology & biochemistry.
- ✓ All the feedbacks for the various sessions organized by the Department during the academic year 2019-2020 were taken online through google forms, to reduce the usage of paper.



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- ✓ Department also used ICT in student assessment where quiz in the form google forms was conducted as part of their CIA III for second & final years.
- ✓ Department of computer Science is working with ICT center to spread environment consciousness and awareness regarding dangers of e-waste and participating in their e-waste management program by collecting electronic waste.
- ✓ To spread Environmental Consciousness, and as part of green initiative, plantation drive was organized by the department of Mathematics along with local NSS chapter where few saplings were planted by staff and students in the campus.
- ✓ Servicing and replacing the old equipment of the laboratories has been taken up, which is otherwise consuming more power by department of physics and electronics.
- ✓ The departmental notices are being sent through emails, google class rooms to all the students.
- ✓ The newsletter is posted on departmental blog online by department of physics and electronics
- ✓ The invitation for various departmental activities like Inter collegiate competitions, national workshop etc. to faculty and students of other colleges is done digitally through social networking media like WhatsApp, email, Facebook etc. Simulation of experiments when the need was felt to replace the old equipment/ICs with new ones.
- ✓ Exploration of virtual labs instead of apparatus of very high-cost department of physics and electronics.
- ✓ A sale of vermi-compost was arranged in the college premises by zoology department.
- ✓ Students of MCA collected single use plastic covers, disposal water bottles, plastic spoons, forks etc., from different departments and also explained about the disadvantages of using plastic, how it is affecting the environment and what precautions should be followed to save our mother Earth.

## ❖ Any Innovation that created a positive impact on the functioning of the department/college

Innovation is change that unlocks new values. It is the process of turning ideas into reality, it's not about ideas, and it's about making ideas happen. Keeping this in view, the college periodically introduces innovative courses, activities and teaching-learning methods. Diverse and innovative teaching methodologies were adopted by the faculty to provide a better understanding of the subject and introduce the students to new concepts of learning by using technology effectively.

### Following innovation that created a positive impact on the functioning of the department:

- ✓ Personal counselling to students which had a positive impact their performance and regularity which in turn helped in improving the overall result of the department.
- ✓ Increased number of student projects and surveys were assigned to students which strengthen the research activities of the department.
- ✓ Active Google classroom participation
- ✓ The nutrition dept organized career counselling session for UG & PG students to equip the students to fend for themselves across the various pivots in their professional lives, and be able to make consciously considered career and skill building choices.
- ✓ Active YouTube channel of the nutrition department where students post video assignments.
- ✓ Designing & printing of e-posters & e-brochures: The students of nutrition UG & PG are allotted the current nutrition topics and they are given individual topics to design e-brochures & e-posters using poster maker app & Microsoft publisher.
- ✓ Diet counselling activity: As part of experiential learning process the department of nutrition conducts diet counselling session for staff, students and parents. Various activities like BMI, anemia checkup, blood sugar, BP checkup is taken up along with diet counselling for various disease conditions. The Centre is open for staff, students and parents. This activity is taken up by PG diploma students under the supervision of staff.





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- ✓ Hospital Internship programme: The PG Diploma students undergo 3 months internship as part of their hands on & skill enhancement training. Each 5-6 students are allotted a hospital where they are trained in various aspects of nutrition care plan which includes nutrition assessment, diagnosis, monitoring & evaluation. The students submit an internship report as well as case studies report of 10 patients at the end of the internship.
- ✓ Participation in seminars, conferences, workshops, symposiums & CNE programs: both UG & PG students are encouraged to participate in various subject related programmes so that they interact with the experienced people like doctors, dieticians & other expert people from the hospital. Also come to know about the recent advances in the field of nutrition.
- ✓ Peer tutoring: students who were irregular and who were found to be academically weak were tutored by few bright students in the class.
- ✓ Online webinar, and mock tests for ACCA and CMA which helped students to prepare for computer-based exams, online exams for professional courses- 12 students passed ACCA foundation One or Three papers- dept of commerce.
- ✓ Conduction of online project viva – Voce for BBM III Year Students on 27th and 28th May 2020.
- ✓ The department of biochemistry encourages college faculty and students to switch to biodegradable sanitary pads by facilitating sale of the ecofriendly products in the college at regular intervals and also creating awareness through guest lectures, survey and campaigning in the college. Positive Impact: Many of the students and Faculty prefer to use biodegradable pads instead of plastic toxic disposable pads.
- ✓ Sending students to internship to NGOs has enhanced their communication and analytical skills. Interacting with children and underprivileged people with special needs has helped to understand the practical outlook of psychology.
- ✓ Bridge course organized for first years titled Integrated Concepts in Biology gave them a boost to look at studying science in a different perspective. Self-motivated, few of first year students always participated in various academic extension activities.
- ✓ CIA III was conducted by dept of BBA and microbiology in the form of google assessment in google classroom to give insight of preparation of online entrance examinations. Students were excited to use their mobile phones to perform their online exam. Immediate results after the assessment was more exciting to the students.



- ✓ Dept of microbiology conducted CIA III by providing the students with case studies about various medical histories. The students had to put on their detective hats to crack down the culprit of the case.
- ✓ Micro base as a concept of generation of a data base of microbes was started in this academic year with an aim to collect information about the various domains of microbes. The same is displayed on the department notice board for reference for all those interested in knowing the unknown.
- ✓ Placement cell launched an android app for the placement cell with all options for ease of use in communication with students during placement drive. (Includes Registration, regular updates relating to placement drives, feedback etc.)
- ✓ Ms. Amtul Saleha (III-year MSCS) developed a website for reaching out to undergraduate students (mathematical combinations) on various career prospects available for them to choose from and all information related once they complete their graduation which is usually needed and asked by a number of students.
- ✓ The Department members were also able to meet frequently by conducting online departmental meetings using Zoom, CiscoWebex, Google Meet.
- ✓ The Department, adhering to the Government guidelines on social distancing and work from home, conducted a international webinar on 'AI powered Corona Detection' and a National Faculty Development Programme on 'Training on Software for Video Conferencing'
