Objective, Summary and Outcome:

Objective of the Workshop:

IoT (Internet of Things) is one of the most important technologies and has a lot of relevance in today's world and everyday life with Internet usage becoming universal. The internet of things helps people live and work smarter, as well as gain control over their lives. In addition to offering smart devices to automate homes, IoT is essential to business. It encourages companies to rethink the ways they approach their businesses and gives them the tools to improve their business strategies. Generally, IoT is most abundant in manufacturing, transportation and utility organizations, making use of sensors and other IoT devices. It has also found use cases for organizations within the agriculture, infrastructure and home automation industries There are numerous real-world applications of the internet of things.

With so much scope for coming up with creative solutions, the dept. deems fit that conducting a workshop on IoT with demonstration and make students participate in building small applications would help them in understanding the importance of the field, promote interest in them to explore, experiment and try in coming up with new ideas and creative solutions related to the field which has immense scope.

Summary and Outcome & Feedback

In view of the growing relevance of IoT in the modern world, the computer science dept of St Ann's College for Women invited Open Hardware Days (OHD) to introduce the computer science students to the topic of IoT. Ms. Hema, Mr. Rithvik Podduturi (CEO) and Mr.

Nagarjuna Thotamsetty (COO) from OHD to conduct a three-day workshop on Internet of Things (IoT) from 29th Aug, 2018 to 3th Sept, 2018.

Day 1 started with the introduction on IoT, its working principle and applications followed by the study of microcontrollers and Arduino UNO in particular. Students were taught simple and multiple LED blink execution including coding and hardware connections.

After this, students got hands on experience with the different types of sensors- temperature sensor to read the room temperature, ultrasonic sensor to find the distance and a motion sensor to detect motion. The day ended with motivating students to start thinking on technology which helps in building products.

Day 2 began with an introduction to the working of IoT products and internet enabled microcontroller, Node MCU. Students were shown the working of how devices like LEDs can be controlled through the use of the internet followed by a study on the cloud and the services provided by it. All the students created a ThingSpeak account which is an <u>open source Internet of Things</u> (IoT) application and <u>API</u> to store and retrieve data from things using the <u>HTTP</u> protocol over the Internet or via a Local Area Network. ThingSpeak enables the creation of sensor logging applications, location tracking applications, and a social network of things with status updates.

The day ended with a detailed review of the student projects for Hackathon with the instructors.

Day 3 was the Hackathon day followed by the expo of projects for students and faculty. The 8 teams presented their prototypes very well to the judges. Some of the ideas include smart fan/life saver to prevent suicide, smart homes (intruder alert system), smart traffic system, smart water tank to prevent wastage of water, smart ICU etc. One top team was offered Internship at OpenHardWareDaysPvt. Ltd. Through this workshop, students developed a proper practical knowledge on working of sensors and the development boards which would help them in future to start prototyping as well as the current development in the emerging field of IoT i.e the importance of it in the future and the trends, products available in the market.
