Report

A two day workshop on Mushroom Cultivation was organized by Departments of Microbiology, Biochemistry & Genetics in collaboration with "S" MUSHROOM AGRITECH, under DBT star college scheme, on 14th& 15th of October 2022. Dr. K Prasuna was the resource person of the workshop and proprietrix of S Mushroom Agritech.

The main objective f the workshop was to provide participants with hands on training on mushroom cultivation & to develop a business startup on mushroom cultivation. Students of B.Sc 2nd year MCZ, MCB, GCM & BBC have participated in the workshop.

Mushrooms are valued as nutritious and delicious food and also possess medicinal properties including anti-cancer and anti-HIV activities.

Small farmers and landless workers constitute major fraction of mushroom cultivation. Mushrooms are short-duration crop with high yield per unit time. Mushroom production provides an ideal opportunity for conversion of agro-waste into wealth, quality food and organic manure. Mushroom being an indoor crop provides vast opportunities for empowering rural and urban women through cultivation, production of value-added products and marketing. It also provides vast opportunities for unemployed youths to take up mushroom cultivation and marketing.

The process of mushroom cultivation was as follows,

- 1. The raw materials used for cultivation of mushroom was paddy straw or wheat straw. Wheat straw is more preferred because it has more nutrition.
- 2. The straw is soaked in a drum with lime water for 24 hours. The ratio is 125g per 50 litres. This is done to remove impurities.
- 3. Then the straw is removed and dried. Drying can be done in natural way by sun drying or in artificial way by using the drier machine. The moisture content after drying should be less than 10 percent.

- 4. Different mushrooms like Oyester mushroom or milky mushroom have slightly different drying techniques.
- 5. After the straw is ready is it made into bags along with spawn for mycelium growth.
- 6. In a cylindrical plastic bag a bottom layer of straw is kept above which the beads like spawn are added which are then again covered with straw and again with beads. Continue till the top of the bag.
- 7. The bag is tightly tied using a rubber band and then placed in a dark and moist place for the mycelium growth.
- 8. After mycelium grows they are transferred into a light room with some holes made on the plastic bag for the growth of mushrooms.
- 9. For Oyester mushrooms a special step called casing is done which is to intimate the process of mushroom growing. This is where the nutrient deficit soil and cockpit are mixed and applied at the top.
- 10. After the mushrooms are large enough they need to be plucked. From each bags 2-3 crops can be harvested.

The working of various devices like AC lamp control using Triac, Digital Voltmeter, Fridge stabilizer etc were explained. Different parts and components of the devices were explained to the students and students could hands on check out these devices..

First device: Integrated chip consisting of regulator (7812-postive and 7912 - negative), Capacitors of 1000 and 1 micro farad. Students were taught about transformers, diodes etc.

Third device: digital volt meter which is used to measure the fixed voltage. The parts of the volt meter was shown.

Key points covered in each session

Day-1 5.12.2022

Session I: Identification of Medicinal plants

This session was basically about the characters used to identy medicinal plants.

Correct identification of the medicinal plants that is used for the preparation of a medicine in traditional medicinal systems like ayurvedic, folk and herbal is very important. The main features required to identify a medicinal plant is its leaf shape, color and texture. Color and texture are the deterministic parameters to identify the species.

Session II: Cultivation of Medicinal plants

This session was maily on cultivational tecniques of medicinal plants

Large scale production of plants with medicinal values is really a challenging task. This session maily focused on the cultivational of plant part specific cultivation of medicinal

plants, like rhizome cultivation(eg. Curcuma, Zinger), fruit (Amla, Black berry) leaf (Aloe vera, Tulasi) Bark plants (Cinnamon)

Session III: Secondary Metabolites

This session was maily on an array of secodary metabolites producted by plants.

Plants produce a wide diversity of secondary metabolites which serve them as defense compounds against herbivores, and other plants and microbes, but also as signal compounds. In general, secondary metabolites exhibit a wide array of biological and pharmacological properties. Because of this, some plants or products isolated from them have been and are still used in treating different diseases. In this session few plants with thier specific secondary metabolites and thier healing properties were dealt.

Day-2 6.12.2022

Session I: Post-harvest management

This session was maily on the post harves management.

Post harvest maintainence and management is a crucial aspect in plant pharmacognacy.

Different plant parts such as roots, rhizomes, bulbs, bark, leaf, fruit and seeds are collected, processed and used in preparation of herbal drugs. Techniques and time to harvest varies with the species and plant parts. General guidelines about technique and time of harvest for different plant parts were discussed.


Session II: Adulteration of plant drugs

Herbal adulteration is one of the common malpractices in herbal raw- material trade. Adulteration is described as intentional or unintentional substitution with another plant. In this session identification of genuine medicinal plant part and types of adulteration was delt.
