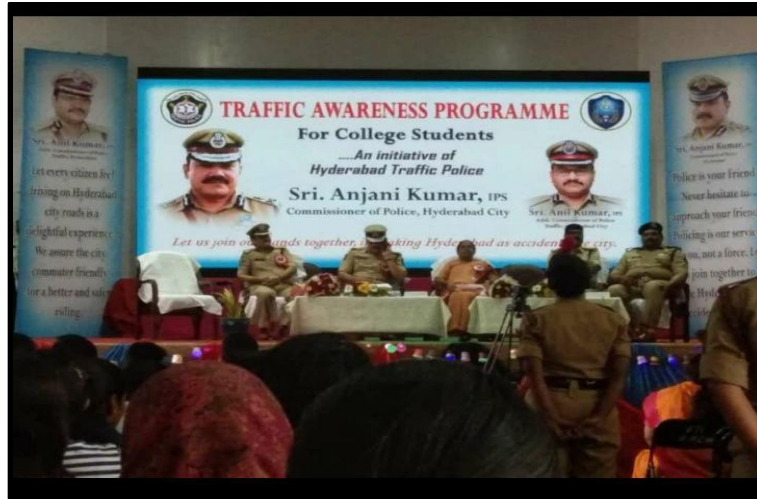


5. Traffic Awareness Program

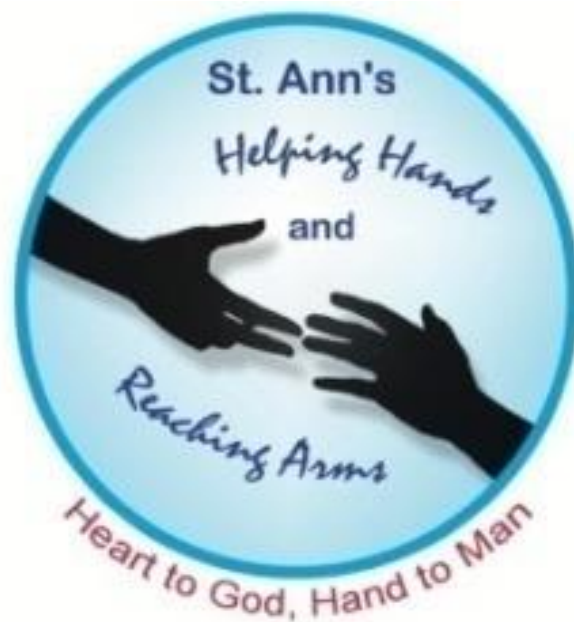

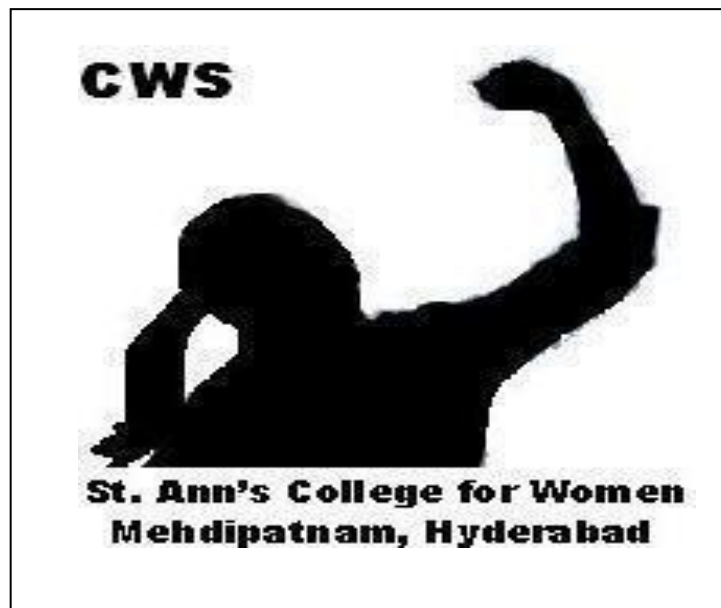

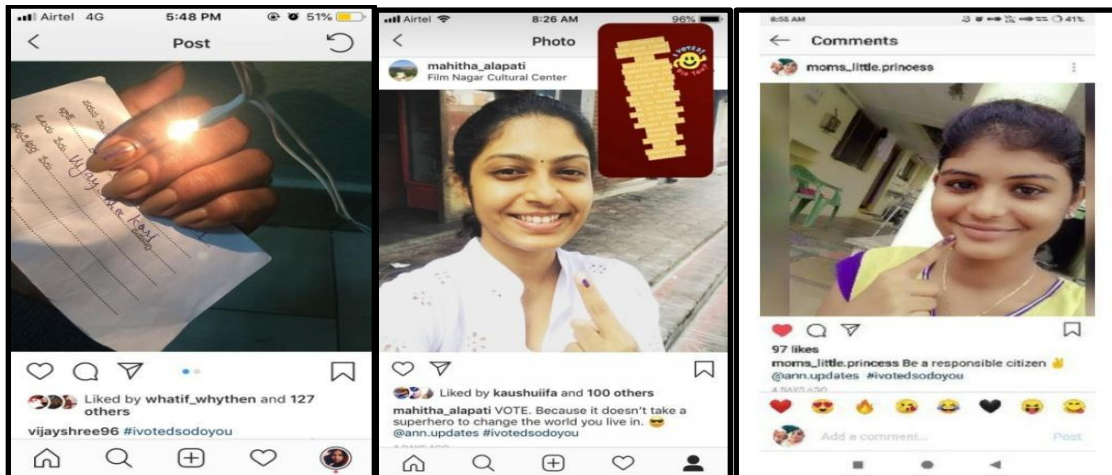
3. #ivotesodoyou- Voters Awareness & Enrollment week

Date: 21st January, 2019


