





Fostering Scientific Curiosity: A Week-Long Celebration of National Science Day 2023

The Department of Biochemistry has been a staunch advocate for science education, and in line with this commitment, it has been commemorating National Science Day on February 28th every year since 2020. In 2023, the department took its celebrations a step further by organizing a week-long series of activities aimed at enriching the scientific knowledge of students in six government schools. These activities included hands-on experiments, interactive teaching kits, and engaging fun activities.

Teaching Kits and Topics:

The key highlight of the celebration was the preparation and utilization of teaching kits by the Biochemistry students. These teaching kits covered a diverse range of topics, ensuring a comprehensive scientific exposure for the participating 7th, 8th, and 9th standard students. The topics included:

Carbohydrate Analysis: Understanding the chemistry of carbohydrates through practical experiments.

Testing Milk Adulterants: Demonstrating methods to identify common adulterants in milk.

Concept of pH: Explaining the significance of pH and conducting experiments related to acidbase reactions.

Chromatography Techniques: Introducing the principles of chromatography and its applications.

Molecular Biology Experiments: Involving the isolation of DNA from cells, offering insights into genetic material.

Activity Execution:

During the week, the Biochemistry students visited the government schools to conduct these educational activities. They organized small groups, ensuring that each student had an opportunity for hands-on learning. The students took on the role of mentors, guiding the 7th to 9th graders through the experiments and concepts.




