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

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Career Oriented Course: Phonetics and Translation

Report: The Department of Arabic has successfully completed phonetic and translation courses. Students are satisfied with the course. The Program at phonetic and translation was of 26 Classes for two semesters. We offered 13 different levels from beginner to advanced, plus accelerated. Classes covering 2 levels in one term. Classes were conducted once a week in the afternoon. Resource person speaks in Arabic and is experienced. The Arabic language program integrates speaking, listening, reading and writing. We maintain small classes to enable adequate time for conversation in every class to find the level of students. Teaching Method: Class is devoted to learning the script and sounds of modern and classical standard Arabic and basic communication and reading skills. Evaluation Method: Final grades for the course will be based on Assignment, Oralexam and Final written exam
